## Business/Action Plan 2023 / 2027

#### Introduction

This plan sets out what the Parish Council would like to do over the period until the next Parish Council elections in 2027. The plan considers the issues facing us and our ability to respond with the resources available. It makes clear that there are choices to be made and how the Council will decide which to prioritise.

#### Context

It is acknowledged that all organisations that provide services to the community, be they public, private or voluntary are facing cost pressures and resource restrictions. The emphasis is on value for money, efficiency, collaboration and accepting that some things just will not get done. Through a planning process, we can have a shared vision and direction, protect what is important and consider new ways of getting things done.

# What is a Parish Council?

The Parish Council is a small local authority. Its councillors are elected every four years at a time in the same way as for other councils. In May each year the councillors choose a chairperson from amongst their number. In Aldington and Bonnington, there are seven councillors representing Aldington and two councillors representing Bonnington who make up the Parish Council, which employs a part-time clerk to manage administration.

## What can we do?

#### **Powers and Duties**

Parish Councils have a number of formal powers, set out in a wide range of legislation. A duty is something that a council must do, a power is something that it may do, if it so decides. A Parish Council cannot do anything that is not permitted in law.

#### **Aldington Pond and Meadow**



#### Suggested plan:

Led by the wild would be happy to try and meadow these areas marked in red and happy to donate yellow rattle seed from our own stock. All of the areas would need to be cut and grass cutting removed. We would need to be put in contact with whoever maintains this area to discuss mowing and management of path and boundaries to meadow. We think it may be useful to have some kind of boundary marker between field and meadow whilst it establishes. We suggest low posts and a rope, with a path wide enough for disabled access.

Are the parish council able to supply a budget for plug plants, this would be the quickest way of establishing the meadow. All needs to be ideally sown in the next few months.

We will happily work with the parish council to recruit local volunteers to support and would seek to engage the school in biodiversity monitoring.
